City Without Walls' Third Annual One-Minute Video Show

Woods Hole, MA—July 13, 2007--City Without Walls' (cWOW) third annual video exhibition is coming to the 16th annual Woods Hole Film Festival. Producer Jon Goldman of Woods Hole, Massachusetts approached his brother, Dr. Ben Goldman, fellow artist and the Executive Director of the Newark-based City without Walls Gallery to further exhibit the exciting show had seen in New Jersey.
