

Prices: \$9.00 for screenings and tributes. \$10.00 for staged reading and parties. Panels are free. Shakespeare on the Cape is \$25. Discounts: \$2 off ticket price for students and seniors, children under 12. \$1 discount for cardholding WGBH members for screenings.

Online purchase of screening and party tickets on sale in advance and during the Festival at Ticket Web at www.ticketweb.com. Mail and Walk in purchase of screening and other tickets and festival passes before and during the festival at WHFF Headquarters (87B Water St. Woods Hole – upstairs from the Woods Hole Market 508-495-3456), The Old Woods Hole Fire Station, (Water Street, Woods Hole), and at the door of each screening, event, or party. Cash or Check only, make payable to "The Woods Hole Film Festival. Inc."

Full Access Festival Pass - \$250.00. Entry to all screenings, staged readings, special events, panel discussions, parties, except The Reel Blues Fest.

Weekend Pass A, The Nobska: - \$90.00. The Nobska Pass entitles the passholder to attend all screenings, panel discussions, special events and parties from Saturday, July 29 through Monday, July 31.

Weekend Pass B, The Buzzards Bay: \$90.00. The Buzzards Bay Pass entitles the passholder to attend all screenings, panel discussions, special events and parties from Thursday, August 3 – Saturday, August 5.

Note that passholders must arrive at screenings, staged readings and panel discussions at least 15 minutes prior to event to guarantee entry, otherwise entry will be on space available basis. Please indicate the user of each pass purchased. Pass is non-transferable.

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THE AUDIENCE AWARDS: YOU ARE THE JUDGE!

Whatever the critics and filmmakers may think, the true test of a film's value is the reaction of the audience. What a critic may acclaim, an audience might find a bore; what filmmakers may see as filmic genius, an audience may find trivial. The Woods Hole Film Festival is proud of the intelligent and discerning audiences who judge the films we present with open eyes, ears, hearts and minds.

The Woods Hole Film Festival was created so that the residents of Woods Hole, Falmouth, and Cape Cod would have a venue for seeing the fine independent films produced but often not seen in traditional cinemas. Over the past decade, it has become evident to filmmakers worldwide that the audiences at the Woods Hole Film Festival are some of the most perceptive and open-minded they have encountered. From this has grown the Audience Awards. The world film community values the Woods Hole Film Festival's Audience Award, as can be seen by the increase in quality and quantity of films being offered this year.

The Audience Awards are given in a number of categories depending on the films shown in a given year. This year the categories are: Best Film of the Festival, Best Feature,
Best Feature Documentary, Best Short Comedy,
Best Short Drama, Best Short Documentary, Best Short Experimental, Best Short Animation, Cape Cod Section

When you attend a film, you will be given a ballot for the films that are in competition at that screening. Please, carefully follow the instructions on the ballot or given by the presenter. The ballots will be collected after each screening. Please, be sure to turn yours in. Your votes are counted and assessed in relationship to the films in that category throughout the festival. Ballots which are not filled out properly are discarded. The votes are tabulated by averaging the ratings. The Best of the Festival is decided for a film rated best against all films in competition in the Festival and can be in any category.

The Audience Awards will be announced at the filmmakers awards ceremony on the last of the festival and posted on the Woods Hole Film Festival web site. Your vote counts and the filmmakers are counting on you.

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
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

Panel Discussion: The future of long form documentary in the age of Internet video

The ecosystem that supports the funding, production, promotion, and distribution of long-form documentary film is changing in many ways. This panel discussion will explore how the long form documentary will be influenced, challenged, and transformed by video on the web, the funding climate, social networking, and changes in audience behavior.

Panelists:

Annie Valva, Director of Research & Development for WGBH Interactive

Annie Valva has over 15 years experience in developing interactive media, including broadband applications, enhanced TV, Web sites, and CD-rom/ DVDs. As Vice President of Content and Technology Integration for Pearson Broadband in London, she oversaw the development and launch of broadband services to primary school children throughout the U.K. Annie spent six years as Director of Technology for WGBH Interactive where she both managed the interactive technology team and produced prototypes for emerging digital platforms. She has worked extensively with high tech companies in order to develop partnerships that showcase high quality content across multiple distribution platforms. Annie earned her Masters in Educational Technology from Harvard University and received her BA in Community Studies and Photojournalism at the University of California, Santa Cruz.

Les Blank, Documentary Filmmaker

Les Blank (The Blues Accordin' to Lightnin' Hopkins, Burden of Dreams, All In This Tea) will be the 2007 Woods Hole Film Festival Filmmaker in Residence, joining a distinguished list of past fellows including Jon Jost (WHFF 2006) and Kidlat Tahimik (WHFF 2005). Blank's first independent films began a series of intimate glimpses into the lives and music of passionate people who live at the periphery of American society. Vincent Canby of the New York Times describes Les Blank as "a master of movies about the American Idiom...one of our most original filmmakers." Blank will screen his most recent film "All In This Tea", made with Gina Leibrecht, on Sunday July 29th. The film takes us across the world to some of the most remote regions of China in search of the best handmade teas in the world, guided by world-renowned tea expert David Lee Hoffman. Additionally Blank, who has made more than 30 films, 2 of which are in the National Film Registry of the Library of Congress, will give a master class, participate in panel discussions and informal festival networking events throughout the 8-day Festival.

Cynthia Close, Executive Director, Documentary Educational Resources Since 1993 Cynthia Close has been the Executive Director of Documentary Educational Resources (DER), a Watertown Massachusetts based non-profit film and video production/distribution company founded in 1968. DER distributes over 700 titles worldwide. Cynthia serves on the Board of Directors of the Society for Visual Anthropology, and the Margaret Mead International Film and Video Festival. She is on the Advisory Board of Women In Film and Video New England, The Camden International Film Festival, ARTVISION, INC., and American Insight Inc. She currently is acting as fiscal sponsor for over 25 documentary projects in production. Cynthia teaches a course in Funding and Selling the Documentary at the Maine International Film and Television Workshops. She has been a guest lecturer at Boston University, Emerson College, Harvard University, Temple University, and MFA from Boston University.

David Tamés, Filmmaker and Media Technologist, Kino-Eye.com

David is a producer, editor, director, cinematographer, and media technology consulant. He has worked in key creative roles on a wide range of independent film and new media projects including "Never Met Picasso," "The East Village," and "Remembering John Marshall," a short documentary about the late ethnographic filmmaker. David recently served as Project Manager launching MIT TechTV, a

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video sharing site for the MIT Community. He earned an MS in Media Arts and Sciences from the MIT Media Laboratory, studied filmmaking at City College of San Francisco, and holds a BA in Philosophy and a BS in Computer & Cognitive Sciences from the University of Florida. David has taught film production classes and often speaks at film festivals and industry events about new techniques, trends, and tools of interest to filmmakers. He blogs at kino-eye.com.
